


# Hvordan markerer regjeringen og politiske partier sin støtte til de mest forfulgte i verden?

Yesterday, (Mars 27, 2016), more than 70 people were killed in Lahore in a suicide attack targeted against Christians celebrating Easter.

Attacks on churches in Pakistan, where 85 people died when two suicide bombers rushed the Anglican All Saints Church in Peshawar.

According to the International Society for Human Rights, a secular observatory based in Frankfurt, Germany, **80 per cent of all acts of religious discrimination in the world today are directed at Christians.**

According to the Center for the Study of Global Christianity at Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary in Massachusetts, an average of 100,000 Christians have been killed in what the centre calls a ‘situation of witness’ each year for the past decade.

**That works out to 11 Christians killed somewhere in the world every hour, seven days a week and 365 days a year, for reasons related to their faith.**
